The Department of Hungarian Philology at Jagiellonian University is one of three institutes in Poland leading research on the history, language and culture of Hungary. Employees (Hungarians and Poles) are awarded multiple grants for conducting their own research activities. In addition to main research interests, the Department's staff educates annually professionals in the field of literary studies and linguistics. The Department has numerous international contacts with Hungarian partners (e.g. Balassi Institute from Budapest) and from other countries. As a result of this cooperation Department's library has grown considerably in the last few years and is considered one of the largest Hungarian libraries in Poland, available to Jagiellonian University students. Thanks to the expansion of the Eduroam network, all employees and students have access to free wi-fi internet in the halls and corridors. Multimedia facilities help to display didactic interactive materials, including movies.

It includes the study of ancient and contemporary literature and issues related to the relations between Polish and Hungarian drama. Studies are also related to the linguistic involving researchers from different countries. The history of the Hungarian film over various periods, including the modern cinema is also scope of Department's interests. Employees also participate in the work on Hungarian phonetics.

The proposed research/project description

The Department of Hungarian Philology is willing to cooperate with a foreign partner, e.g. in the field of research on issues related to Hungarian cinema from a historical and/or an analytical perspective. Researchers have experience in this field. Books published so far have been dedicated to selected artists and specific problems. In the field of literature joint research may focus on the issues of the relationship of Hungarian literature with partner's country literature in order to address currents, and tendencies. The contemporary problems create a great chance for an interesting research. Interest in Hungarian history may also be interesting.
