Research offer

Brief description of the department (key research facilities, infrastructure, equipment) (up to 1000 characters)

The Institute of Public Affairs was established at the Faculty of Management and Social Communication on 07.07.1997. Its primary mission involves conducting research into public affairs and educating managers in the public and non-governmental sector in Poland.

The Institute and its Faculty are housed in a building located in the Campus of the 600th Anniversary of the Jagiellonian University Revival, near Pychowice and Ruczaj districts. The entirety of the Campus is situated on a former military site, which also covers the Special Economic Zone (Kraków Technology Park).

The four-storey building, about 23 700 sqm in area, has enough place for up to 2200 students.

Among the facilities there are lecture halls, classrooms and seminar rooms, computer labs, a library







and a TV studio, as well as specialised laboratories equipped with sophisticated devices for
monitoring and testing the human brain. Teaching rooms are fitted with audiovisual equipment for
different types of presentations and communicating knowledge to the students. The Institute is also
a workplace for ca. 450 research fellows.

The Institute of Public Affairs conducts research in the fields of public management, functioning of the public sphere in Poland and the European Union and public policies – policymaking, implementation and impact of policies on the public sphere and public life in Poland.

In particular the Institute is focused on studies into: educational and territorial management, civil society and non-government organisations (NGOs), projectification of the public sector and higher education, as well as management control and combating and preventing corruption.

There are several research teams operating within the Institute, working in a number of public management study fields. Below is a list of potential research areas we would be interested in:

- a) projectification of the public and non-government sectors and the social and organisational effects of this trend,
- b) institutional conditions and changes which determine the functioning of the state and public administration authorities in Poland and the European Union, along with the challenges and demands placed on the administration of public and non-government organisations brought about by said processes,
- c) contemporary challenges in higher education in Poland, the European Union and throughout the world,







- d) the role auditing in public sector governance, prevention of pathological social phenomena such as corruption and fraud,
- e) evolution in the function, organisation and structure of the non-government sector from modest unofficial beginnings to translational agencies,
- f) educational management educational leadership, learning environments, evaluation
- g) design thinking in organisation.
