Research field

Our research concentrates around the languages and cultures of ancient Greece and Rome. The study of ancient linguistics (Latin grammar, Indo-European philology) and the study of a broad scope of Greek and Roman literatures are represented in the Institute research, together with the methodology of teaching Latin.

The academic interests of our staff comprise also the study of cultural interactions between classical cultures and the Oriental civilizations, as well as their presence in later cultures,.

We are open for the proposals of cooperation concerning broad spectrum of topics dealing with Classical languages, cultures and their reception and use. We are especially interested in the topics that have already been studied in the Institute:

- Late Ancient literatures (Sidonius Apollinaris and the late Roman Gallic authors, late Ancient and early Medieval poetry, the Trojan myth in late antiquity, late classical and Byzantine historians, early Christian literature, the *Alexander Romance* and the legends of Alexander in late antiquity;
- Ancient theatre and its modern receptions;
- The literature of Flavian and Antonine periods;
- Ancient rhetoric and political writings;
- Modern Greek poetry and folklore;
- Greek and Latin linguistics;
- History and methodology of teaching classical languages;
- The reception of classical tradition in later cultures (including popular culture);
